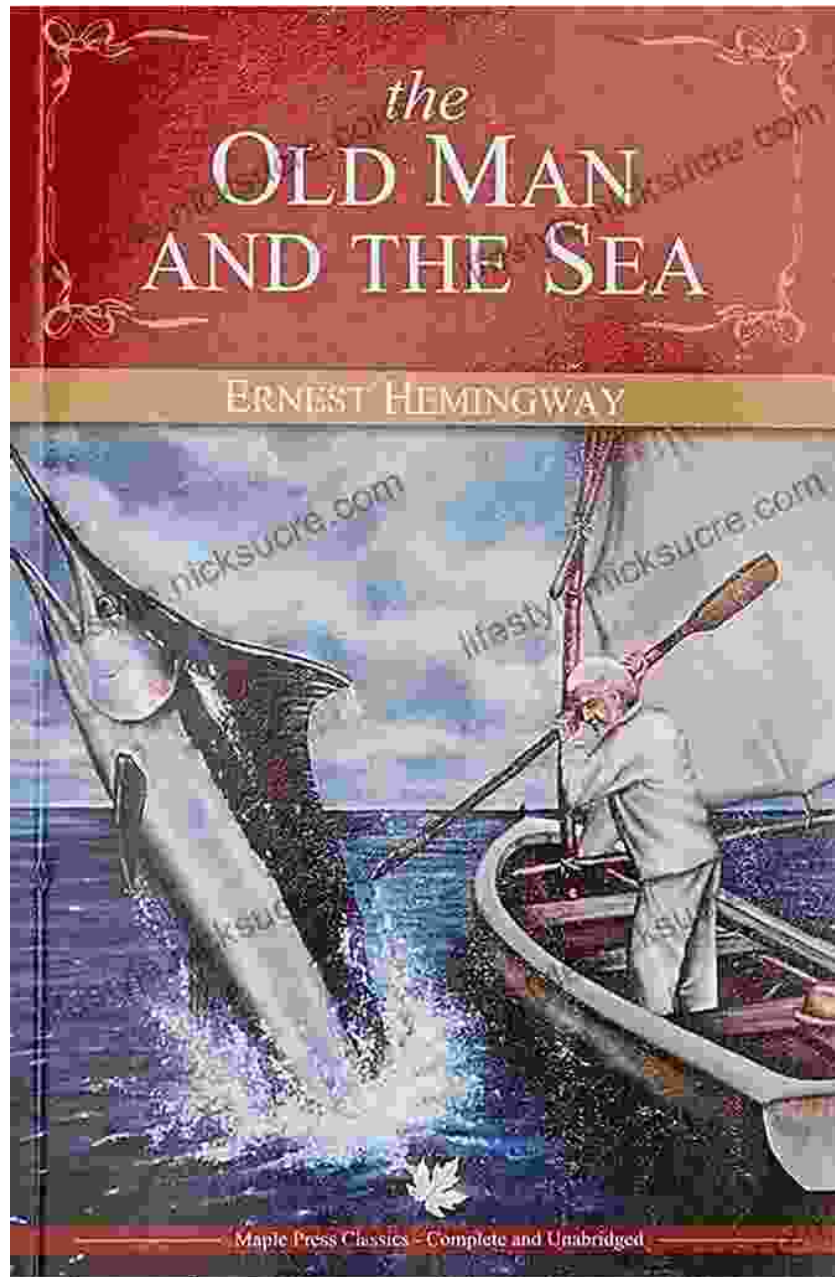

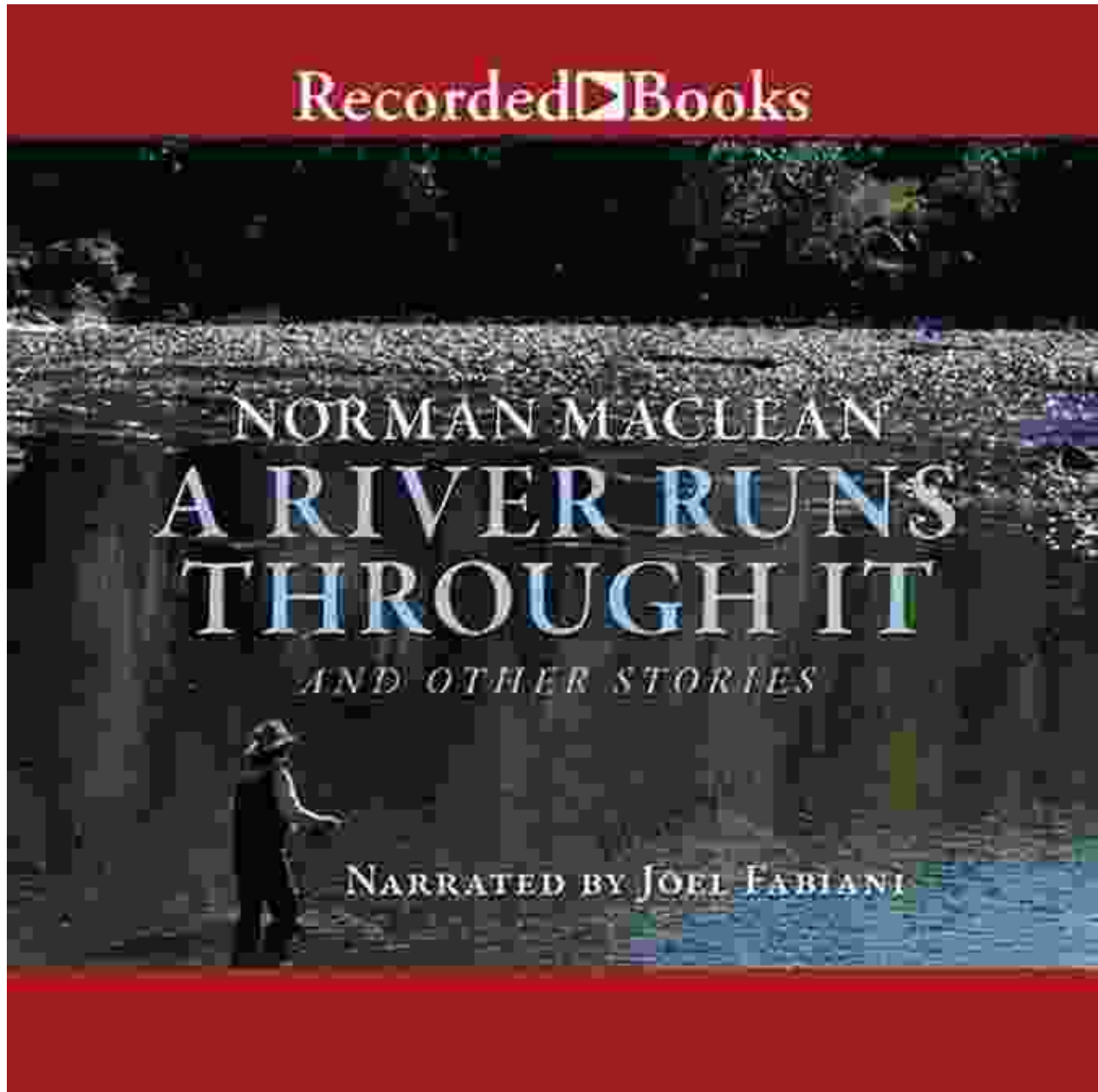
The Old Man and the Sea
